

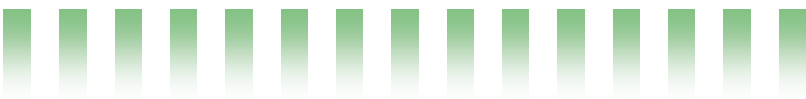

Out & About is a division of I imagine!. We offer a unique Summer Camp for school-aged children (7-21 years), with developmental disabilities, who will benefit from participation in the community. We are a community-based program and offer specialized services in small group settings.

Participants must be able to cooperate safely in small group settings, and safely travel in the context of the community.

We utilize therapeutic recreation as a framework for our activities and practice positive instruction in order to encourage community participation, socialization, communication, health, safety, and the achievement of individualized goals.

Out & About Summer Camp promotes the health, strengths, and abilities of the participants. The Out & About team is eager to answer any questions you may have about Summer Camp.

REGISTRATION & INTAKE

For First-Time Attendees

Our registration process is thorough, and may appear lengthy. We appreciate your efforts in filling out all of the required documents to help us better provide for your camper. The more updated information **we can gather from you, the better we can support your participant's** needs and aspirations. Once we have received all of the documents included in the registration packet, we can proceed in registering your participant for a fun and enriching experience with Out & About! Out & About requires any person who has not attended our services in the last two years to participate in a brief intake process so we can cooperatively determine whether our services are the best fit. O&A Summer Camp activities are available for participants ages 7 to 21 who will benefit from participation in the community. Registration cannot be processed until the intake is complete. *If you are representing a person entirely new to Out & About, please contact Caitlin Looney at 303-926-6489 at least two weeks prior to the registration deadline of Monday, April 23rd.*

REGISTRATION & INTAKE

Confirmation Packet

A Confirmation Packet will be sent to all registered participants the second week of May. The packet will include:

1. Registration Confirmation- listing the days the participant is registered as well as any days that the participant is on the waitlist. Waitlisted participants will be notified as soon as possible if space becomes available.
2. Permission Packet, if we do not already have it (mandatory to attend camp)
3. Activity Waivers (if applicable)
4. Basesite Coordinator Information

SEIZURES, DIABETES, G-TUBES, EPI-PENS

Out & About Summer Camp operates according to Colorado State Child Care License and Developmental Disability regulations. In the event that your camper requires g-tube intervention, has seizures, diabetes or might need an epi-pen, our licensed RN, Kevin Ross, builds a custom protocol from information the family provides and trains **staff specifically on your child's nutritional and medical needs, prior** to the start of Summer Camp. Please contact Mary Galgoczi to make those arrangements.

ACTIVITY DESCRIPTIONS

On the Move

Monday Mornings

On the Move is a fun energy release in which campers have the chance to learn new sports and try out games for all skill levels. *On the Move* is held at many locations including area parks, local recreation centers and sensory engaging facilities. *On the Move* incorporates the mind and body while fostering teamwork!

Therapeutic Recreation Skills Focus:

Social Skills (teamwork, positive communication)

Skill Acquisition (gross and fine motor skills, eye hand coordination, strength and endurance)

Cognition (learn rules to new games, community access)

Swimming

Monday & Wednesday Afternoons

We use adaptive aquatics techniques to enhance swimming skills, pool safety skills, physical abilities, social interaction and the relaxation of our campers. We encourage participants to excel at their own pace and make choices to increase independence and ability level while swimming indoors at local recreation centers.

Therapeutic Recreation Skill Focus:

Skill Acquisition (physical endurance and strength, swimming strokes)

Social Skills (positive peer interactions, playing/initiating games with friends)



Bon Voyage!

Tuesday Full Days

With all day adventures to exciting destinations, *Bon Voyage* gives campers a chance to experience fun field trips to large venues. Destinations include Waterworld, Elitch Gardens, The Wildlife Experience, Jungle Quest and an end of the summer party at the Boulder Reservoir. These interactive activities provide a multisensory experience while offering campers a chance to practice skills required to successfully navigate the community.

Skill Acquisition (physical endurance)

Wednesday Mornings

Be challenged while experiencing the abundant natural resources here on the Front Range of the Colorado Rockies! Campers will have the opportunity to ride horses, paddle canoes and kayaks, go fishing, learn archery and other outdoor skills. Using experiential education to foster learning, we emphasize tactile, auditory and visual sensory integration. Outdoor challenges will be structured into our activities to add elements of excitement, fun and personal challenge.

Art Exploration

Thursday Mornings

Campers will explore various art mediums including paint, clay, pastels, paper, fabric and beads while learning how to express themselves creatively. Campers can increase fine motor skills to become proficient with scissors, paint brushes, markers and other tools. This class is a place to explore self-expression and build creative thinking. They can gain self-esteem and self-awareness as campers experience the freedom that art has to offer.

Therapeutic Skills Focus:

Skill Acquisition (fine and gross motor skills)

Cognition (improvement of memory, prioritization, planning)

Psychosocial (interpersonal skills, expression of feelings)

Emotional (improving self-regulation, easing anxiety, easing feelings of loss, loneliness, guilt, and frustration)

Rhythm in Motion

Thursday Afternoon

Participate in a fun activity where you can openly express yourself through music and dance. Using many different modalities such as yoga, guided imagery, musical interpretation, song writing and singing, creative writing, as well as the use of humor therapy, you will experience the health benefits gained from active self expression and body movement. Work on flexibility, learn new dances, play games, sing songs and learn methods for relaxation.

Therapeutic Skills Focus:

Sensory Integration

Skill Acquisition (stretching, gross and fine motor coordination)



Cultural Parade

Friday Mornings

Celebrating diversity by enjoying the many cultural opportunities in the Denver Metro area, campers get to understand their own heritage and become familiar with others. We will educate campers on cultural traditions through interactive tours and celebrations!

Therapeutic Skills Focus:

Social Skills (cultural norms, positive peer interactions)

Cognition (cultural awareness, community access)

Strike-O-Rama

Friday Afternoons

Hit the alley and knock over some pins while hanging out with friends! Bowling is a great activity to develop hand-eye coordination, as well as being a wonderful place to socialize with peers and develop friendships. Bowling promotes sportsmanship and increases independence through skill acquisition.

Social Skills (sportsmanship, peer interaction)

Cognition (counting, score keeping, tying shoes, community access)
